




### Making a Difference in the Lives of Children and Families

While many other churches take a break for the summer, we have actually stepped up our activity. I resumed a children's program on Thursday evenings, at which the children are learning to sing songs of the faith, navigate their bibles, and recite answers to New City Catechism questions. If you have been in worship, you have heard their voices participating loudly and proudly in our assemblies. I am very proud of our children.

A group of women have also started preparing meals on Monday at our church kitchen. They call the ministry "Bountiful Tables." They not only cook three dinners for their own families, but they also make extra meals for dozens of people around the community of Nowata, most of whom pay for these pre-prepared meals, but also many who have come upon hard times and need a little extra help. When a local family lost everything they had in a fire, the Bountiful Tables ministry had meals to donate for their care. The meals are always scrumptious, healthy, and locally sourced if possible. Many local food producers have

chosen to donate to the group out of admiration for their project. They ask for \$4.50 per serving, which is half the price of the cheapest for-profit venture such as Hello Fresh. They will also be holding monthly fundraisers in order to compensate for the cost of the program.

So far, Bountiful Tables operates at a deficit. We are hoping that increased purchasing of meals and fundraiser items, plus a little extra support from the church, can make it a sustainable ministry in the coming months, as we discern its viability in the long term. As it currently performs, about a hundred people's lives are impacted for the better by this ministry every week. I am inclined to think it has much greater capacity as these women make a name for the ministry and build up its infrastructure.

I would ask you to pray for these new or resumed ministries, that they be a pleasing offering to our Lord, and that he would prosper these ministries to bless many more lives. Thank you for all of the support you have given your church in these tumultuous years. Let us continue forward in faith together with confidence in our shared spiritual heritage.



Voice of the Martyrs, a Christian relief organization based in Bartlesville, is asking for prayers for Christians in Libya:

Front-line workers request prayer for eight Christians in Libya, including six Libyans and two foreigners, who have been imprisoned for their faith: "Please pray for these believers who have recently been imprisoned to stand firm in their faith as they endure persecution for the name of Christ." The front-line worker added that some of those now being held in jail "could be sentenced to death for their obedience to God's Word and for sharing it with others in the country." Libya has remained unstable and chaotic since the revolution and overthrow of its dictator in 2011. Three opposing governments vie for control, and the conflicts have severely damaged the country's infrastructure and rendered gospel work in the country extremely difficult.
